This is a summary of the annual report of the Labor Association of Wisconsin Health Benefit Plan ("Plan") (EIN: 14-6241865), a health and welfare benefit Plan, for January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2014. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Labor Association of Wisconsin, Inc. has committed itself to pay all eligible insurance premiums incurred under the terms of the Plan.

Basic financial statement

The value of Plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the Plan, was \$274,401 as of December 31, 2014, compared to \$236,771 as of January 1, 2014. During the Plan year the Plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$37,630. This increase includes unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of Plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the Plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The amount of benefits paid to participants during the Plan year totaled \$3,614. The amount of administrative expenses paid during the Plan year totaled \$2,149.
